## DATABASES

There are several resources available to you online or via the public computers here at the library. You can access Evergreen and OverDrive (both of which allow you to view and reserve holdings through our statewide consortium) as well as Inspire, the state's research database, both onsite and online.

Two more databases are available to our patrons, but accessible only on the library's public computers:

—Ancestry.com, where you can unlock the "story of you" with sources like censuses, vital records, immigration records, family histories, military records, court and legal documents, directories, photos, maps, and more.

—Cypress Resume, a simple and effective tool for creating a professional-looking document. Simply input your name, contact information, work history and education; choose your desired job or skill set; select a job statement from the imbedded collection; submit, and viola! You have a professionally written and formatted document perfect for that job interview. Best wishes!
