# **WWI HISTORICAL PROGRAM**

Sponsored by the Friends of the Library, Chris Reidy will present a sequel to his spring program on World War I. As the News Times reported, Reidy will discuss how, 100 years ago, American military forces went into combat against the experienced, battle-hardened might of the German army on the Western Front. Though untried and dismissed by both friend and foe, the Doughboys of the American Expeditionary Force proved their worth during the high tide of Germany's last gamble—an offensive to win the war in the summer of 1918.

Reidy's discussion will center on the American contribution to eventual Allied victory in the fall of 1918, examining the "big picture" of the war, while also describing the efforts of local units and men who fought in those final battles. To conclude, we will look at President Woodrow Wilson's efforts to bring lasting peace to the world and the failure of the Versailles Treaty to ensure his vision. Ironically, the seeds of WWII were sown in the aftermath of the "War to End All Wars."

The public is invited to join the Friends at Arts Place on Wednesday, November 14th at 6 pm for what is sure to be an insightful program.
